But with the diligent care from our garden volunteers, there was still a bountiful harvest of egg plant, <u>okra</u>, <u>spinach</u>. The real winners in the garden were the squash, with almost 45 lbs

and 30 lbs of tomatoes! A grand total of 120.5 lbs of produce was grown in July. If all goes well, we are hoping to continue to harvest peppers at the end of August. Donations are appreciated to help pay for the costs associated with planting, harvesting and maintaining the garden. The variety of produce and the quantity varies from day to day.




Adult Book Club
