The preschool arts and crafts program is held every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month from 11:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.





It's transition time in the garden. Hopefully the okra, pepper and bean plants will bounce back following the recent rains and temperature drop to produce through October. In the meantime, we will start planting our cool weather crops. First to go in the ground will be root crop seeds like carrots, radishes and beets, followed by small transplants of cilantro, broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower. We'll also be seeding a cover crop like fava beans, crimson clover or Austrian winter peas in a few of the beds to help improve soil health for next year.

Outside of the garden, we're busy preparing a variety of **seed packets** from plants grown in the garden to sell at the Library's upcoming Fall Yard Sale.


















The Spicewood Community Library's Adult Book Club meets in the library the 2nd Wednesday of every month at 9:30 a.m. Everyone is invited to attend.
